

2 Year Old Program

Our 2-year-old classes are designed to introduce children to a learning environment, increase confidence, and build social skills. Age appropriate centers and hands on activities combine with songs, finger plays, and stories engaging children and teaching them that learning is fun. Through our multi-sensory program, children learn through visual, auditory, and kinesthetic (things we see, hear and touch). This is the best method to reach individual learning styles and meet the needs of each child.

Our 2 year old curriculum includes:

Creative Movement

Our dance instruction correlates with the weekly preschool themes, teaching skills such as balance, coordination, large motor skills, rhythm and tumbling.

Art

Art classes increase creativity as children freely express themselves. Students learn to recognize colors and explore many textures and artistic styles.

Music

Our daily music class gives children the opportunity to learn patterns, rhythm, and musical terms. Students will learn and sing theme related songs, play instruments, and gain an appreciation for music.

Reading/Writing

Children will gain an appreciation for literature while exploring books and stories. We work to develop fine motor skills at this age to prepare children for writing.

Math

We provide many opportunities to learn about numbers! Singing songs such as Five Little Ducks, Five Monkeys Jumping on the Bed and Five Green and Speckled Frogs, provide great practice in learning number sense.

Science

Children will explore the world around them through self-guided hands on exploration in our theme related science centers. We aim to deepen children's natural curiosity as we conduct many fun and exciting multi-sensory science experiments and classroom activities.

Social Studies

Our 37 themes cover new subjects each week such as dinosaurs, insects, health and nutrition, safety, emotions, space and manners.

Character Traits

We focus on a new character trait each month helping children to learn the importance of honesty, respect, compassion, patience and many more important traits.

Our program follows standards published by The National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), Utah Association for the Education of Young Children (UAEYC), Utah State Office of Education and the National Dance Education Organization.
